June is the sixth month of the year, and it holds significance for various reasons:

Summer Solstice: In the Northern Hemisphere, June marks the beginning of summer and contains the summer solstice. On this day, which usually falls on June 20, 21, or 22 (depending on the year), we experience the longest daylight hours of the year. It's a time when the sun reaches its highest point in the sky, and we celebrate the arrival of warm weather and extended daylight. Juneteenth: Juneteenth, observed annually on June 19, commemorates the end of slavery in the United States. Also known as Emancipation Day, it holds deep historical significance. In 1863, President Abraham Lincoln issued the Emancipation Proclamation, declaring more than three million slaves in Confederate states to be free. However, it wasn't until June 19, 1865, that Union soldiers arrived in Galveston, Texas, and informed African Americans living there that slavery had been abolished. The former slaves celebrated with prayer, feasting, song, and dance, marking the first official Juneteenth celebrations. Today, Juneteenth is a time to reflect on freedom, resilience, and the ongoing fight for equality.

So, June is a month of both natural transitions and historical remembrance, making it important in various ways.

The Little Free Library Program has donated 2,600 library boxes and 138,000 books in communities in the US and Canada with limited access to books. Overall, there are over 175,000 library boxes in 121 countries worldwide.

Last year alone they placed more than 530 Little Free Library Boxes In many communities like the one assembled here at Indian Lake. Let's always support our Little Free Library.

The Smithville Hospital Authority Board awards \$20K to Bastrop County Public Health Department

The Smithville Hospital Authority Board donated \$20,000 to the Bastrop County Public Health Department to contribute to the community assessment work underway in partnership with the Texas A&M School of Public Health. The funds will also contribute to the school's consulting services in the establishment of the public health department in Bastrop County.

The background: The Bastrop County Public Health Task Force began meeting in February, partnering with Texas A&M to conduct a community needs assessment in Bastrop County.

With **hurricane** season beginning June 1 and running through Nov. 30, National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration officials predict an above-normal Atlantic hurricane season.

What you need to know: The latest NOAA forecasts are urging residents along the Atlantic Ocean and the surrounding areas to expect a more active hurricane season than normal, with an 85% chance of an above-normal season.

The details: The NOAA is forecasting a range of 17 to 25 named storms in the Atlantic Ocean with winds of 39 mph or higher, including:

- Eight to 13 hurricanes with winds of 74 mph or higher
- Four to seven major hurricanes with winds of 111 mph or higher

Let's all look over our properties and if we have any sick or dead trees or broken tree limbs that need to be removed let's get them take care of, trees can fall and cause severe damage or death. Please make sure that any patio furniture or possible debris that can be thrown around is taken care of and secured. We all know how these storms enter the Gulf of Mexico and have a tendency of coming right up towards the Austin area and Smithville is in that path.

Recipe of the Month:

Peanut Butter Oatmeal Chocolate Chip Cookies

Ingredients:

- 1 cup (130 g) all-purpose flour
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- ¹/₄ teaspoon salt
- ¹/₂ cup (113 g) unsalted butter, at room temperature
- ¹/₂ cup (135 g) creamy peanut butter
- ¹/₂ cup (99 g) granulated sugar
- ¹/₃ cup (71 g) light brown sugar
- ¹/₂ teaspoon vanilla extract
- legg
- ¹/₂ cup (45 g) rolled oats
- 1 cup (170 g) semisweet chocolate chips

Instructions:

- Preheat oven to 350 degrees F. Line two baking sheets with parchment paper and set aside.
- Whisk together the flour, baking soda and salt; set aside.
- On medium speed, cream together the butter, peanut butter, granulated sugar, brown sugar and vanilla extract, for about 3 minutes. Add the egg and beat to combine. On low speed, gradually add the flour until just combined. Stir in the oats, and then the chocolate chips.
- Use a large cookie scoop (3 tablespoons) and drop dough onto prepared baking sheets about 2 inches apart. Bake for 10 minutes, or until the cookies are lightly golden. Cool completely on the baking sheet and then store in an airtight container at room temperature.
