It is illegal for your pets to run at large in Bastrop County and owners can and will be held liable and ticketed. This is to help protect our pets and community. There are civil and criminal penalties including felonies in Texas if your dog attacks or harms another person. Be a Responsible Pet Owner.


Looking for a libation? Quinto Patio also has a full bar, and offers non-alcoholic options like Jarritos, Mexican Cokes and Aguas Frescas.

Bastrop museum to offer quilt exhibit, related events starting Feb. 7

The Stitched Exhibit will spotlight the evolution of quilting, ranging from the mid-1800s through today, with a special focus on the personal and communal histories accompanying them, museum spokesperson Rachel Hatch said.

Recipe of the Month:

Red Velvet Cupcakes w/Cream Frosting

Ingredients:

For the Cupcakes:

- 4 tablespoons (57 g) unsalted butter, at room temperature
- 34 cup (149 g) granulated sugar
- 1 egg
- 2½ tablespoons (13 g) unsweetened cocoa powder
- **2 tablespoons** red food coloring
- ½ teaspoon vanilla extract
- ½ cup (120 ml) buttermilk
- 1 cup (125 g) + 2 tablespoons all-purpose flour
- ½ teaspoon salt
- ½ teaspoon baking soda
- 1½ teaspoons distilled white vinegar

For the Cream Cheese Frosting:

- ½ cup (113 g) unsalted butter, at room temperature
- 2 cups (227 g) powdered sugar
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- ¼ teaspoon salt
- 8 ounces (227 g) cream cheese, chilled and cut into 8 pieces

Instructions:

- Preheat oven to 350 degrees F. Line a standard muffin/cupcake pan with liners.
- On medium-high speed, cream the butter and sugar until light and fluffy, about 3 minutes. Turn the mixer to high and add the egg. Scrape down the bowl and beat until well incorporated.
- In a separate small bowl, mix together the cocoa powder, vanilla extract and red food coloring to make a thick paste. Add to the batter and mix on medium speed until completely combined. You may need to stop the mixer to scrape the bottom of the bowl, making sure that all the batter gets color.

- Reduce the mixer speed to low and slowly add half of the buttermilk. Add half of the flour and mix until combined. Scrape the bowl and repeat the process with the remaining milk and flour. Beat on high until smooth.
- Again, reduce the mixer speed to low and add the salt, baking soda and vinegar.
 Turn to high and beat for another couple of minutes until completely combined and smooth.
- Divide the batter evenly between the cupcake liners and bake for about 20 minutes, or until a thin knife or skewer inserted into the center of the largest cupcake comes out clean.
- Cool for 10 minutes and then remove cupcakes from the pan and place them on a cooling rack to cool completely before frosting.
- **Make the Frosting:** Using an electric mixer, beat the butter, powdered sugar, vanilla, and salt on low speed until smooth, then mix for an additional 2 minutes, scraping down the bowl as needed.
- Increase the speed to medium-low and add the cream cheese one piece at a time and mix until smooth, then mix for an additional 2 minutes.

Notes

• This recipe can be doubled to make an 8 or 9-inch layer cake.
