



Indian Lake Cleanup Saturday, March 8, 8am-1pm Dumpsters and "Curbside" Brush Pick Up

Dumpsters will be available at the Pavilion, to all Indian Lake Residents until they are full and hauled off that day. The drop off will be monitored to keep prohibited items out of the dumpsters and not be overloaded past the top dumpster rim.

Prohibited items for dumpsters:

No mattresses or box springs

No paint or hazardous/corrosive liquids

No car batteries

No tires

No masonry, cement, bricks, in large quantities

Brush pick up from "curbside":

Put your brush at the road <u>by 8am Saturday</u> and volunteers will pick it up. We won't come back if it's not out by 8am. Shortly after this event, the county will turn the brush pile into mulch, so we want to collect as much brush as possible now.

Who Was Austin Icon Barbara Jordan?

Barbara Jordan was the first <u>everything</u>. She was the first Black woman elected to the state legislature, the first Black woman in America to oversee a legislative body, the first Black woman elected to the U.S. Congress from the South since 1898, and the first Black person and first woman to give a keynote speech at the Democratic National Convention.

Jordan, a native Houstonian, moved to Austin after retiring from politics in 1979. While you might be familiar with her name, or the statue of her at Austin-Bergstrom International Airport, here are some other things about the trailblazer you should know:

She Successfully Led an Effort to Include Hispanics in the Voting Rights Act.

When the 1965 Voting Rights Act, which bars racial discrimination in voting, was up for extension 10 years later, Jordan pushed for it to include language minorities, notably Hispanic voters, the Texas State Historical Association says.

"The barriers continue," Jordan said at the time. "And so must the Voting Rights Act — the most effective statute minorities have to guarantee that one day those barriers will come down."

Jordan Couldn't Attend UT Because of Segregation but Taught There as a Professor for Almost 20 Years.

Jordan was part of the 1956 graduating class at Texas Southern University, the school's first, after it was created by the Texas legislature to avoid integrating UT. But 22 years later, Jordan was appointed the Lyndon Johnson Chair in National Policy at UT's Lyndon B. Johnson School of Public Affairs, and taught there until the early 1990s.

Jordan Was Almost the First Black Woman on the U.S. Supreme Court.

Jordan was former President Bill Clinton's first choice for the U.S. Supreme Court seat that was later filled by Ruth Bader Ginsburg. According to the Washington Post, Clinton asked former Texas Governor Ann Richards if Jordan would be interested in the seat. Richards sent her assistant to ask Jordan, who laughed and said, "Oh, think who I'd have to sit next to," before adding, "No. I like my life." Clinton later speculated that Jordan's health was part of why she declined the

St. Patrick's Day



St. Patrick's Day also called Feast of St. Patrick, and St. Patty's Day is observed on March 17 and marks the death date of Saint Patrick who is the patron saint of Ireland. In the early 17th century, it was made an official Christian feast day observed by the Church of Ireland, the Catholic Church, the Eastern Orthodox Church, and Lutheran Church. The day celebrates the arrival of Christianity in Ireland as well as the culture of Ireland and commemorates the death of Saint Patrick.



Recipe of the Month:

Chicken Carbonara Pasta Bake

Ingredients:

- 10 ounces diced pancetta
- 16 ounces spaghetti
- 4 large egg yolks
- 2 cups grated parmesan cheese
- 1 cup heavy cream
- 2 cups cooked chicken breast
- 1 tablespoon Italian parsley

Directions:

- 1. Gather all ingredients. Preheat oven to 325 degrees F (165 degrees C). Coat a 9x13-inch baking dish with nonstick cooking spray.
- 2. Cook pancetta in a medium skillet over medium-high heat until lightly browned and crisp, about 5 minutes. Set aside.
- 3. Boil spaghetti in lightly salted water for 5 minutes. Drain pasta and reserve 2 cups of pasta water.
- 4. Meanwhile, add egg yolks to a large mixing bowl and whisk until smooth.
- 5. Gradually pour 1 1/2 cups of hot pasta water over egg yolks, whisking vigorously, making sure to whisk constantly so eggs do not scramble.
- 6. Whisk in Parmesan cheese, then heavy cream.
- 7. Add cooked pasta, pancetta, and chicken to the sauce, toss to combine. Transfer pasta mixture to prepared dish.
- 8. Bake until hot and sauce has thickened for 20 minutes, stirring halfway through.
- 9. Remove from heat, stir and let stand for 2 to 3 minutes allowing sauce to continue to thicken. Additional pasta water can be added, as desired, for saucier pasta.
- 10. Garnish with parsley and extra Parmesan cheese.
